Newcastle Chemical Engineer and Energy Researcher Professor Terry Wall has been awarded the prestigious Baragwanath Award by the Australian Institute of Energy. The award, recognising a lifetime of outstanding contribution to coal science research in Australia, was presented at the Conference Dinner on Monday 18th of November as part of the 10th Australian Coal Science Conference held in Brisbane.



Terry Wall AM FAIE ATSE

Professor Terry Wall AM FAIE ATSE has been involved in coal research at the University of Newcastle NSW since 1968. He was a foundation member of the Australian Institute of Energy (in 1978) and has Membership No. 6.

Currently his research group activities are all coal focussed including projects on oxyfuel technology for carbon capture and storage, carbon dioxide cleaning and compression, pulverised coal injection, coking coal evaluation and emissions from coal use. Since 2010, he has been a Science Leader of the Australian National Low Emission Coal R&D (ANLECR&D) organisation

The Baragwanath award is named after Mr George Baragwanath and was first presented by the Australian Institute of Energy in 1981. Thirteen eminent researchers have previously received the award since its inception.
