MEMBERSHIP

Since the Institute's establishment in 1978, members of the Institute have been attracted from all energy fields and professions. They include accountants, economists, engineers, fuel technologists, geologists, lawyers and others involved in energy matters and the social and environmental impacts of energy production and use. Our members are from industry, government, research and development and education or have a specific interest in energy.



The categories of individual membership include **Fellow, Member, Associate, Graduate and Student.**

Corporate Members of the Institute comprise Australian and international companies and other organizations engaged in energy-related activities or the supply of goods and services to the energy industries.

Members of the Institute are given the opportunity to:

- increase their knowledge and understanding of energy issues and improve their technical skills;
- meet and exchange views with other professionals engaged in energy-related activities; and
- contribute, through presentations at conferences, seminars and meetings of the Institute, to the discussion of current policy and technical issues in energy resources, production and use.

Members qualify for reduced registration fees for AIE meetings and events.

Individual and Corporate Members receive the Institute's quarterly journal **Energy News**. The journal contains up-to-date reports on developments across energy and related fields and technical papers and presentations by Institute members, together with news from the Institute.

A monthly newsletter, with details of coming events and other items of interest, is emailed to members.

The Institute has a significant presence on the internet at its website (www.aie.org.au), providing information about the Institute and its activities and additional services to members and others with interests in energy issues, including a daily energy news clipping service. Member only services are also being established on the site, including Special Interest Groups in particular energy fields and Forums to discuss current energy issues. STRUCTURE OF THE INSTITUTE

The Institute comprises an elected National Board and regional Branches located in States and major cities. Most Branches have associated Young Energy Professional Groups to encourage our future energy leaders. Members may also form or join internet-based Special Interest Groups (SIGs).

The Board is responsible for the overall policy and strategy of the Institute and the organization of national activities, while the regional Branches and their YEP Groups, provide the principal forum for interaction and exchange between Institute members. SIGs provide a means of on-line communication between members with a common interest in specific aspects of energy.
